

*** YOU WILL ALSO NEED A HAMMER TO COMPLETE THIS PROJECT**

TIP: Read the instructions thoroughly before starting your project.

- 1 Sort & identify all pieces. Ask an adult for help & locate a hammer.
 - 2 Place the Floor (A) on a flat surface.
 - 3 Take the House Front (C) & on the inside bottom edge, run a thin line of glue.
 - 4 Place against Floor edge, matching up nail holes, & place a nail into each hole. Use the hammer to push the nails into place in the wood. Mind your fingers!
- TIP:** Don't hammer the nails all the way in. Leave a little room to make it easier to slide the Side Walls into place.
- 5 Screw one small hook into the top edge of the House Front (C).
 - 6 Set aside Floor & repeat steps 4-6 on the House Back (D) connecting it to the Floor piece.
 - 7 Take a Side Wall piece (E) & run a thin line of glue on either side edge. Gently slip side walls between the House Front & House Back making sure to match up the nail holes. Place a nail into each hole & hammer them into place. Repeat with other Side Wall piece.
 - 8 Secure your structure by hammering all nails firmly into place.

- 9 Select Perch (B) & the House Front (C). Place a small amount of glue on one end of the Perch & insert into the small hole on the House Front (C), creating a perch for the birds to rest on.
- 10 Lay Roof Panel (F) flat on working surface. Place Roof Panel (G) at a 45-degree angle on top of Panel (F), matching edges & nail holes. This is the only way to put these pieces together. This will insure proper alignment. Once you have lined up the nail holes, remove Roof Panel (G) & run a thin line of glue along the connecting edge. Place back up at a 45-degree angle & place a nail into each hole. Hammer nails completely into place.
- 11 Paint or decorate as desired, then let sit overnight to let the paint & glue dry.
- 12 Connect one end of the chain to a hook. Run it through a hole in the bottom of the roof, across the top & back down through the hole on the other side of the roof. Connect the end of the chain to the other hook.

TIP: If the chain is too long, use pliers or tweezers to feed the chain through the holes or to shorten it.

- 13 You have just created a perfect little home for chickadees, nuthatches & finches.
- 14 Hang outside on a branch or post where you can observe your feathered friends & welcome them to their new cozy & warm home.
